

Basics of Streaming Sacrament Meeting

There are 5 basic elements to streaming live Sacrament Meetings. Optional solutions and detailed readings are identified below.

1. Receive direction from your ecclesiastical leader. Consider the following questions.

- Who has the Stake President assigned to drive the solution in the stake?
- Does the person responsible to drive the solution have a preferred technology he wants the wards to use?
- How much budget does the responsible person want to allocate to this solution?

2. Determine a camera source. Any of the following can be used:

- Permanently mounted camera in stake center or other buildings.
- Mobile devices (smartphone or tablets) using streaming apps
- USB webcams connected to laptop/desktop with streaming software.
- All-in-one camera/audio/encoder such as Mevo.

3. Determine an audio source

- Chapel audio can be an excellent audio source. Especially since all microphones run through the audio source. When using **Chapel Audio**, the signal going into the camera will need to be attenuated. For more info see the additional reading article below.
- External microphone can be routed into the audio input on most selected devices.

4. Determine an encoding device that combines audio and video sources and streams them to reputable cloud platforms. Such encoding devices include:

- Existing Teradek installed in stake center and other streaming enabled meetinghouses.
- Mobile devices utilizing apps such as Larix or LiveNow.
- Laptop/Desktop using free software solutions like OBS.
